Day 01: International arrival in Lima

Assistance on your arrival in Lima and transfer to your selected hotel. Free time to rest and prepare for starting your trip around this unusual city and magical country.

Day 02: Sightseeing Tour

After breakfast, guided sightseeing tour to the most attractive and important sites in Lima, the " **City of Kings** ". The tour includes Lima's Historical Centre, passing by Plaza San Martin, The Main Plaza, the Government Palace, the City Hall, the Cathedral and its Religious Art Museum, the Church of Santo Domingo, with the tombs of Santa Rosa and San Martin de Porras, and Lima's Colonial Balconies. We will visit the Convent and Church of San Francisco, the greatest monumental complex of Colonial Art in America and Cultural Heritage of Humanity. The tour includes a visit to the Basilica of 21 altars, Convent of Cloisters, Capitulary and Clementine Rooms, Chorus and Library of the Monks, a Museum showing 11 paintings of the Rubens School, the Sacristy with paintings of Surbaran and Ribera, its great patio decorated with Seville tiles of XVIth Century, Moorish arches and underground Catacombs. We will also visit El Olivar Park with olive trees brought from Spain in the XVth Century, the Central Park of Miraflores and Larcomar, a symbol of modern Lima and a tourist and entertainment center as well as a privileged site to enjoy an amazing view of the Pacific Ocean. Back to the hotel for rest

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Day 03: Lima - Iquitos

After Breakfast transfer to Lima Airport for your fly to Iquitos upon arrival transfer to the selected hotel balance of the day free, Iquitos The city can be reached only by airplane or boat, with the exception of a road to Nauta, a small town roughly 100 km (**62 mi**) south (**which is not connected to the country's main road network**). Ocean vessels of 3,000 to 9,000 tons and 5.5 meters (**18 ft**) Draft can reach Iquitos via the Amazon River from the Atlantic Ocean, 3,600 kilometres (**2,200 miles**) away. Most people travel within the city via bus, motorcycle, or the ubiquitous Auto Rickshaw (**mototaxi, motocarro or motocar**). This is a modified motorcycle with a cabin behind supported by two wheels, seating up to three persons. Transportation to nearby towns often requires a river trip via *pequepeque*, a small public motorized boat.

Day 04: Iquitos - Three Frontiers: Santa Rosa (Peru) Leticia (Colombia) Tabatinga (Brasil)

Early Morning at 06.00 we leave by speed boat to the three frontiers 8 hrs trip Boats from Iquitos to Leticia and Tabatinga go several weekly, a trip of 8 - 10 hours (**fast boat**) Leaving or entering Peru via the Río Amazonas inevitably means crossing the three - way frontier, nearly 300km from Iquitos. The cheapest and most common route is by river from Iquitos, some ten hours in a *lancha rapida*, a big speed boat with two outboard motors, Our services go all the way to **Leticia (Colombia)** or **Tabatinga (Brazil)**, but many stop at one of the two small Peruvian frontier settlements of Santa Rosa or Islandia; at Chimbote, a few hours before you get to **Santa Rosa** and on the right as you head towards the frontier, is a small police post, the main customs checkpoint (*guarda costa*) for river traffic. Upon arrival transfer to our hotel in Leticia (Colombia) balance of the day free

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Day 05: Leticia - Tabatinga - Manaus by Ship Cargo 04 Days - 03 Nights

Boat from Tabatinga to Manaus leaves by ferry overnight in hammock **optional private dormitory**. Tabatinga is small Brazilian town right next to Columbian town of Leticia (**only road separates them**). We will stay in Leticia while waiting for our boat to come because hostels are nicer. There is no border check between this two towns and Santa Rosa on Peruvian side, but as soon as we get out of the towns you will encounter passport checks. You can get Brazilian stamp only at Policia Federales, which is kind-of on the way, but plan to get there before leaving.



Boat is very good, sizable, stable, and a bit overcrowded. (**there is no other choice**), food and water are included. Trip lasts 4 days and 3 nights, you leave 1pm, and arrive at 7am fourth day. This was the cleanest one that I have been on, bathrooms and showers are fine, floor is not rusty or dirty. Three meals per day are provided, and they are good and large. Coffee is available most of the day, and drinking water is filtered and very cold. Bring your own hammock and some kind of blanket because nights can be cold. Suggestion is to take upper deck and position yourself around middle of the ship. Weaving in and out of the multicolored hammocks stung up in every single square inch of the boat, we would bang into people at both ends, heads and asses, and would have to swing them out of the way in the corridor just to make our way to other end of the boat. Scenes of children being breastfed, laundry being stung up on every side railing, locals reading biblical pamphlets, and people napping at all hours of the day. We were surprised as to the number of *young children* travelling on the boat. They would be crammed upside down, this way and that, tucked away into their parents hammocks during the night, and running around naked during the day...playing with action figures, trucks, dolls, or skipping ropes.

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Day 08: Manaus Arrival

On your day arrival transfer to the selected hotel balance of the day free. Manaus lies on the Negro river, 7 km from where it meets the Solimões river to form the Amazon river. Manaus is the capital of the Amazonas state and the hub of the entire Amazon Region, with a population of 1.6 million. Manaus today is a busy trade center, its roots beginning in the rubber trade industry. One of the must see in Manaus is the Amazon Opera House and its surroundings. The Opera house is considered as the most important architectonic work from the rubber golden age. You should also visit the Courthouse Palace - the most representative building of the eclectic architecture of the city - with its sober and austere façade. Manaus serves as the best-equipped entry and exit point for those eco-tourists heading into the Amazon Rain Forest. This region is very humid and has heavy rainfall all year round.

Day 09. Manaus Amazon

am you are picked up at your Manaus hotel starting the journey. The shuttle crosses the Rio Negro Bridge and brings you to the Açutuba beach. From there, we continue by fast boat along the Rio Negro river and the beautiful archipelago. On arrival at the lodge in the Anavilhanas natural reserve area, you will be welcomed and accommodated to your room. We will show you around and explain the details helpful for a comfortable stay. After lunch we will enjoy a canoe ride for piranha fishing. You will also experience the Anavilhanas islands, their animals, monkeys and with information from the guide. The group will return to the lodge along the river shortly before dinner where you may

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enjoy the hammocks overlooking the Rio Negro river and a cooled drink After dinner the group will leave by canoe for caiman (**Alligator**) night spotting. The guide will explain about the night life speciality, amazon nature and show you the different caimans. Depending on the sky, you will enjoy a ride back to the lodge with moon light and stars reflected in the river. Enjoy a good night sleep at the jungle lodge

10 Day: Manaus Amazon

For the early birds who like it, an early canoe trip allows to enjoy the sunrise before breakfast. After breakfast we will leave for a trekking journey through the jungle. You will learn how natives use and read the jungle, medicinal plants, how to communicate with the help of trees, which plants to use to protect against a Jaguar, the possibility to see animals such as jungle spiders, lizards and birds. The trekking also allows to take a swim in a little waterfall before you head back to the lodge. After lunch you will depart to visit a genuine Indian village and experience their rituals, dances and traditional clothing. If lucky, you might get invited to a dance. You are also allowed to take pictures. Your guide will be able to translate to the tribe leader if you have question. From the Indian village, the group continues to visit the unique pink dolphins in the Rio Negro. You can either stay in the water and watch them directly or swim with the pink dolphins. After these two exciting excursions, we will head back to the lodge. Dinner will be prepared at a fireplace above the river bank where you enjoy a BBQ meal The beautiful view, sound of the jungle and camp fire provide a great atmosphere while enjoying soft drinks, a beer or caipirinha if you would like to. Have a good night sleep in your room to be prepared for an exciting next day

11 Day: Manaus Amazon

After a good morning breakfast, guests have the opportunity to go paddling in traditional wooden canoes (**still used by the native Indians**) and explore the small channels. This allows you to go at your own speed, have a swim or just float with the current. For those who prefer, you can also sleep-in, enjoy the veranda hammocks at the lodge, drink coffee/tea and read a book. The group will be back at the lodge shortly before lunch. After lunch, we will visit the Anavilhanas village with

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their friendly local families and kids. You discover some great fruits and seasonings that grow here. It's a pleasant walk along the river bank and a small, native village, that celebrates its tradition away from a big city. We will prepare the overnight camp in the jungle, hammocks, insect nets and learn more about the forest and local nature. We will be back at the lodge so you can enjoy a shower, and get ready for dinner. After dinner, we will get ready for the overnight stay in the jungle. Take your pillow with you for a comfortable night in the hammocks. Fall asleep while listening to the sound of the jungle. It is a great and pure experience

12 Day: Manaus Amazon - Manaus City

After returning to the lodge from your overnight jungle stay, you will enjoy your breakfast. Guests will depart for a trip in the Archipelago of Anavillhanas with the opportunity to see different birds and experience this unique natural reserve. We will be back to the lodge before lunch, afternoon (**return**) After lunch we will transfer our guests back to Manaus arriving in the city around 4pm.. Please note that the order of the individual activities might change depending on weather, sky conditions or animal sightings.

13 Day: Manaus to Rio Branco

Transfer to Manaus Airport for your fly to Rio Branco city (**1996 pop. 228,907**), capital of Acre state, NW Brazil, on the Acre River. Rubber and Brazil nuts are its chief products; there is also some farming. Rio Branco has air connections with the major cities of Brazil, but river travel is still an important means of transportation. Rio Branco was built on the site of a former rubber plantation. It has a university. is actually a Brazilian metropolis found inside the Valley of Acre in the northern areas of Brazil, it really is the most inhabited area inside the state, together with 305,954 people - practically 50 percent of the state population. Rio Branco has also been one of the primary cities to surface within the banks of the Acre River of the amazon. In 1913, It started to be a county. In 1920, it took over as capital of the state of Acre, plus in the year 1962, the state capital.

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14 Day: Rio Branco - Puerto Maldonado - Mazuko (Peru)

After breakfast we will drive to Puerto Maldonado city Peru side for 8 to 9 hrs approximately on your time arrival we will transfer to the selected hotel, Puerto Maldonado is small Amazonian city in the Madre de Dios region of Peru. The city itself holds little interest to tourists, however its great starting point for visiting some of the amazing Jungle reserves, particularly the Tambopata reserve which is close by.

15 Day: Mazuko - Cusco

After breakfast we will drive in private car to Cusco for 8 to 9 hrs approx. The road is new and is called inter oceanic, it was made during 2009 - 2010. During our trip we will stop for pictures and see Ausangate mountain, is a Mountain of the Willkanuta mountain range in the Andes of Peru. With an altitude of 6,384 meters it is situated around 100 kilometers southeast of Cusco. The mountain has significance in Inca Mythology. Every year the Qollou Rity (Quechua for " **Star Snow 2**") festival which attracts thousands of Quechua pilgrims is celebrated about 20 km north of the Ausangate at the mountain Qullqipunku. It takes place one week before the Corpus Christi feast.



The region is inhabited by llama and alpaca herding communities, and constitutes one of the few remaining pastoralist societies in the world. High mountain trails are used by these herders to trade with agricultural communities at lower elevations. Currently, one of these trails, " **the road of the Jr. E. Guzman Barron 3816 Urb. 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Apu Ausangate ", is one of the most renowned treks in Peru. The area has four major geological features, the Andean uplift formed by Granits, the hanging glaciers and glacial erosional valleys, the Permian formation with its singular colors: red, ochre, and turquoise and the Cretaceous, limestone forests.

16 Day: Cusco: Sightseeing tour and Nearby Ruins

Breakfast. Morning at leisure. Lunch on your own.

In the afternoon, we will have a guided sightseeing tour of Cusco visiting the Main Square, the Cathedral and the Temple of the Sun or **Korikancha** Then, we drive out of the City to visit the Inca sites of Kenko, Tambomachay, Puca Pucara and the impressive Fortress of **Sacsayhuaman**, strategically built on a hill overlooking Cusco and famous for its enormous carved stones, some of them standing over 9m / 30ft high and weighing over 350 tons.



at 20.00 p.m. evening get ready to enjoy a dinner with a folklore show in a typical restaurant where the musicians play their melodies with Andean instruments of beautiful sounds, while typically dressed dancers will show you different ancient Peruvian dances.

17 Day: Cusco - Rainbow Mountain - Cusco

A fantastic day tour (**with trekking**) to the so - called 7 Color Mountain, leaving from Cusco.

Located in southern Peru, in the Cusco region, this route will take you through stunning landscapes with glaciers, snowcapped mountains and crystal clear rivers and lakes. Pass by local villages of

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Quechua descendants and explore the breathtaking surrounding nature. The colors of the Rainbow Mountain will leave you speechless. You will be picked up from your accommodation at around 3.00am and start making your way to Arco (**on the route to Puno**) eventually getting to the Checacupe district (**2 hour journey**). Then we will continue to Pitumarca and a number of small villages till we reach the Hanchipata - Quesuno community (**another 1.5 hours**). From here we start our hike. We will be able to enjoy the view of numerous mountains around as well as the Ausangate glacier, and we will be able to witness up close the local wildlife and camelids in their natural environment. The trek lasts for about 3 hours until we get to the stunning landscape of Vinicunca (**Rainbow Mountains**). Here we will have about one hour to relax and take amazing pictures of this natural wonder. We then hike back to the starting point of the trek, and from there return to Cusco (**arriving at approximately 18.00**).

18 Day: Sacred Valley of the Incas - Sanctuary of Ccochahuasi - Pisac Market - Perolnuyoc Waterfall - Hanging Hotel (Sky Lodge) Ollantaytambo (Private guide and car)

Early morning excursion to the Urubamba Valley, the Sacred Valley of the Incas. on our way 30' from Cusco we can stop in Ccochahuasi Animal Sanctuary (**Santuario Animal de Ccochahuasi**) The family-run and privately owned Ccochahuasi Animal Sanctuary rescues and rehabilitates animals that have been ill-treated or victims of poaching. Visitors can tour the grounds and meet some of the rescued animals, such as pumas, Peruvian hairless dogs, alpacas, and llamas, as well as the gigantic Andean condor



After getting to know the animals, you can take some time to visit some of the small **onsite exhibits**, where you can understand how the animals wool is refined and naturally dyed, before finally being expertly woven into fabrics, tapestry's, clothing or a variety of other products. Women from native communities offer live examples of traditional (**and intricate**) weaving techniques, using basic tools and wooden looms.

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Visit to the picturesque Indian Pisac Market held on **Tuesdays, Thursdays and Sundays**, the shopping paradise of the Andes where barter is still practiced. Enjoy the unique atmosphere during a typical lunch. In the afternoon, passing through the Towns of Calca and Urubamba, we visit the Inca Fortress and Citadel of Ollantaytambo, built to guard the entrance to this part of the Valley, and protect it from possible invasion from the tribes in the Lower jungle. You can walk through the quaint streets of the nearby Town, and get a good idea of what this strategic Military, Religious, and Agricultural Centre was like during the era of the Inca Empire.



Waterfall of Perolnuyoc

Hike to the Waterfall and Archaeological Site of Perolnuyoc is an unusual tour that mixes the cultural with ecotourism. A tour that will take you deep into the sacred valley and you will appreciate one of the spectacular works of nature hidden in a forest of abundant vegetation, you will be able to refresh yourself in its crystal clear waters. We will also visit the archaeological center that sits on top of the Racaypata or Perolnuyoc waterfall. we will have lunch in a family house of **Rural community in Socma** they will teach You how to hew a variety of Marble stone. The most representative dish is La Merienda (**Meal with Corn, Guinea Pig, Special Tortilla**) The typical drink is the chicha made of fermented corn " **Chicha de Jora** " and frutillada, fermented strawberry last one. The most relevant celebrations are on May 03rd " **Cruz Velacuy** " festivity to the cross of Jesus Crist and on August 02nd " **Angels Virgins** " with typical dances,



Then we will stop for 5' to see a Hanging Hotel, sleep in this hotel, people must climb 400 mts. of Via Ferrata or hike an intrepid trail through ziplines. One night at this place will make your dreams

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come true. This hotel is composed of three exclusive capsule Suites with a total capacity of 8 people. The vertically hanging transparent capsule suites are situated at the top of our 1200 ft mountain with a 300 degree view of the majestic Sacred Valley. Hand crafted out of aerospace aluminum and weather resistant polycarbonate, each suite comes complete with four beds, a dining area and a private bathroom



At the end we will visit Ollantaytambo Ruins lie in the town of Ollantaytambo situated approximately 60km from Cusco at the end of the Sacred Valley and are a great example of Incan architecture. In the mid-15th century the Inca Emperor Pachacuti conquered the town of Ollantaytambo and re-built it as a religious, political and military complex as well as a resting place for the Inca nobility. During the Spanish conquest of Peru, Ollantaytambo served as headquarters for Manco Inca the resistance leader who retreated to Ollantaytambo following his defeat in the siege of Cusco in 1536. He then subsequently successfully defeated the Spanish in a battle at Ollantaytambo by flooding the valley below. The Spanish led by Hernando Pizarro subsequently returned with a far greater army and eventually took control of Ollantaytambo while Manco Inca fled to the city of Vilcabamba. The fortress is located on the western side in the area known as Aracma Ayllu and is made up of a series of imposing, terraces, temples, platforms, paths and walls and offers excellent views of the surrounding countryside, the town of Ollantaytambo itself and the Incan storehouses or 'Qollqa' built on the Pincuylluna mountain opposite the ruins.

Day 19: Ollantaytambo - Santa Teresa (By Car) Aguas Calientes (trek 3 hrs)

After breakfast, We continue the journey to Santa Teresa, along a winding ascent toward the Abra Malaga and the snowy veronica is located at an altitude of 4,316 meters where we can enjoy the magnificent landscapes of the Cusco geography. After a short break of 15 minutes in the Abra Malaga, the descent into the jungle of the Inca trail through the different climates that combine the paradisiacal landscapes of majestic snow to the hot jungle of the Inca Trail to Machu Picchu is undertaken. To the height of Alfamayó find an Inca trail in admirable condition fully paved. Place where begins the process of asphalt road, continue towards the district of Santa Maria; Located at **Jr. E. Guzman Barron 3816 Urb. Condevilla Señor SMP whatsapp: +51991761297**

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an altitude of 1,575 meters

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Then we can walk for 30' to **Santa Teresa Hot Spring** Constructed on the slopes of the mountain and on the banks of the Urubamba River, the thermal water complex has three pools, of different sizes and depths, which are supplied with medicinal water that varies between 40°C and 44°C. The thermal baths of Santa Teresa differ mainly from the other springs of Peru because of its crystalline waters. These medicinal waters possess properties to treat cutaneous ulcers, bone pain and rheumatism. In the thermal baths you can also submerge under cold streams from the Uripata lagoons, which provides a comforting sensation. At the bottom of the pools there is soft sand and around the pools we can contemplate rocks, vegetation, the sound of the river and the mountain. The thermal baths of Santa Teresa are fully equipped with bathrooms, showers, dressing rooms, soccer fields, space for camping, cafeteria, kiosk for food and beverage supply and a viewpoint. It also has a hydro massage system. It is a very pleasant place to rest after extensive walks such as Machu Picchu and Choquequirao

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Santa Teresa - Aguas Calientes (Machupicchu Town)

Afternoon we will take a car to Machupicchu Hydroelectric Station it's take us 30' drive to continue the journey of adventure, those who wish to walk are three hours of Hydroelectric to Aguas Calientes " **Town of Machu Picchu** "; where we will place in our respective assigned hotels in this itinerary tours to Machu Picchu will have some free time,

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Day 20: Aguas Calientes (Machupicchu Town) Machu Picchu - Sun Gate - Cusco

rise to Bus Station for a 20' journey to the famous Inca Citadel of Machu Picchu, also known as "The Lost City of the Incas ". bus drive, climbing 6km of winding road, to the incredible site of Huayna Picchu also known as Wayna Picchu (Quechua " Young Peak ") The number of daily visitors allowed to enter Huayna Picchu is restricted to 200 is a mountain in Peru around which the Urubamba River bends. It rises over Machupicchu, the so - called lost city of the Incas, and divides it into sections. The Incas built a trail up the side of the Huayna Picchu and built temples and terraces on its top. The peak of Huayna Picchu is about 2,720 meters (8,920 ft) above sea level, or about 360 meters (1,180 ft) higher than Machu Picchu. According to local guides, the top of the mountain was the residence for the high priest and the local virgins.



Machupicchu Every morning before sunrise, the high priest with a small group would walk to Machu Picchu to signal the coming of the new day. The **Temple of the Moon** , one of the three major temples in the Machu Picchu area, is nestled on the side of the mountain and is situated at an elevation lower than Machu Picchu. Adjacent to the Temple of the Moon is the Great Cavern, another sacred temple with fine masonry. The other major local temples in Machu Picchu are the Temple of the Condor, Temple of Three Windows, Principal Temple, " **Unfinished Temple** ", and the Temple of the Sun, also called the Torreón. Then we'll participate in a guided tour of the Citadel, visiting the Main Plaza, the Circular Tower, **The Sacred Sun Dial** the Royal Quarters, the Temple of the Three Windows and various burial grounds.



The Sun Gates of Machu Picchu boast a picture - perfect vantage point overlooking Peru's most famous ruins. Tourists flock to this outcrop high in the Andes Mountains to enjoy the same view featured on virtually every postcard depicting the Machu Picchu citadel. Also known as Inti Punku,

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the Sun Gates consist of two stones perched at a narrow passage in the crevice of the mountain just above Machu Picchu. The sun shines brilliantly through this portal each day when it rises - hence the name.



Machupicchu Museum & Orchid Garden

The museum has the aspect of a small rural house, but at the same time dynamic and modern, where you can find around 400 cultural pieces divided in 7 rooms, that explain in the simplest and most enjoyable way the history and significance of Machu Picchu. Among the best examples displayed in the museum the following stand out: the constructive tools of copper and bronze, as well as pins and anthropomorphic representations, a clear proof of metallurgical ability of the Incas; we can also find lithic objects and vessels made of clay, possibly used to do rituals. The site museum also offers visitors the possibility to explore the "Orquideario" (**The Orchid Garden**), with more than 400 species of plants and a "Mariposario" (**Butterfly Garden**) that houses species unique in the world. **The Andean Cock-of-the-Rock** is Peru's national bird. One of the most famous birds of Peru with stunning head-dress of orange-red feathers that remind some of the orange-red fringe that Incas used to wear as a badge of his rank.
